



Whirlscape's Minuum keyboard beta now available on Google Play Store

Tiny, one-dimensional, virtual mobile keyboard frees up mobile screen space



TORONTO, Canada (August 19, 2013) — **Whirlscape Inc.**, creators of <u>Minuum</u>, "the little keyboard for big fingers," today released the Minuum beta for Android on the <u>Google Play Store</u>. This is the first opportunity for the public to download the hotly anticipated app, previously available only to initial beta testers. Priced at \$3.99, Minuum is a tiny, linear, one-dimensional touchscreen keyboard that frees up mobile screen space while allowing fast, accurate typing.

The keyboard's extremely successful <u>Indiegogo campaign</u> in spring 2013 raised 873 per cent of its initial funding goal. Over **1.2 million people** worldwide viewed Minuum's teaser <u>video</u>, and the keyboard earned coverage in more than 150 media outlets and nearly 30 languages. Ranked by number of funders, the Minuum campaign is in Indiegogo's top 10 of all time—and number two among all technology campaigns. Following Minuum's 10,000-user private beta launch in June 2013, tens of thousands of people have signed up to the waiting list in anticipation of today's release.

"Releasing the Minuum keyboard beta to the public is very exciting for us," said **Will Walmsley**, CEO of Whirlscape. "Our new concept of what a keyboard needs to be has already received exceptional feedback from early beta users, and we look forward to even more people using Minuum with this public release."

The Minuum public beta release for Android is the first phase of the **Minuum Keyboard Project**. This project seeks to simplify typing on mobile devices and enable typing for wearable technology such as glasses, smartwatches, and more.
